**This Will** was proved at London the  
 twenty third day of December in the year of our  
 Lord one thousand seven hundred and twenty one =  
 before the worshipful George Harris Doctor of Laws =  
 and Surrogate of the Right Honorable Sir William  
 Boyne knight also Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or =  
 Commissary of the prerogative Court of Canterbury =  
 lawfully constituted by the Letters of Elizabeth Martin  
 widow the Widow of the deceased Thomas Smith and  
 Joaquin Andraes the Executors named in the said  
 Will to whom Administration was granted of all and  
 singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said =  
 deceased having been first sworn duly to administer.

 and solely for her use and benefit so long as she  
 and wife Elizabeth shall think proper to continue the  
 same. Item I give and bequeath unto my son William  
 Muddock of the parish of Saint Dunstons in the County  
 of Middlesex the sum of five Guineas to be paid by  
 my said wife Elizabeth Muddock whom I nominate and  
 appoint whole and sole executrix of this my last will  
 and Testament. Item I give and bequeath unto my  
 son John Muddock of the parish of Saint John in  
 Great Brittain the sum of ten pounds of lawful money of  
 Great Brittain as also a two shilled silver quart  
 cragg. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter  
 Mary Elizabeth Muddock the sum of ten pounds of  
 lawful money of Great Brittain. Item I give and  
 bequeath unto my faithful servant Mr. James Smith  
 the sum of ten Guineas of lawful money. Item I  
 give and bequeath unto my worthy friend Mr.  
 Samuel Ballard the sum of one Guinea. Given under  
 my hand this 4th day of November in the year of  
 our Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirty and  
 William Muddock. Signed in the presence of James  
 Smith. Samuel Ballard. Mr. Robertson.

 surrogate of the Right honorable Sir William Wynne  
 knight also Doctor of Law Master Keeper or Comptroller of  
 the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted  
 by the Oath of Elizabeth Muddock widow the Relict of  
 the deceased and the sole executrix named in the said  
 will to whom administration was granted of all and  
 singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the deceased  
 having been first sworn duly to administer.
